#### Overview of the political and financial activities

This Statement of Accounts provides a report on the political and financial activities of the Braintree and Witham Constituency Labour Party (*the Party*) for the year ended 31 December 2023. Its registered address is:

#### Review of political activities

2023 proved a successful year regarding elections to Braintree District Council with 8 gains (the highest number of gains in the East of England). We now have a functioning group of 9 councillors from the towns of Braintree, Witham and Halstead. Another 100 votes spread across the District would have seen a further 4 gains (thereby ending the Conservative's rule of Braintree District). Elsewhere, we stood candidates in nearly all seats, making inroads in both Maldon and Colchester.

#### Membership

The Party's membership remained steady during the year.

#### Committees

The Party is financially managed by a Joint Executive Committee of delegates from Braintree and Witham Constituency Labour Parties. The day to day running is managed by the Party agent who is responsible to the Joint Executive Committee

#### **Branches**

The whole of the joint constituencies are covered by an operational branch structure with regular meetings. Various resolutions have started life in a branch meeting and ended up with the NEC or General Secretary's office. Only Halstead & Hedingham maintain a separate bank account that is under the control of the Party.

#### Campaigning

Thank you letters were distributed following the elections and 25,000 Christmas cards ended our street work across the two constituencies.

Staff changes saw Lynn Jefferis retiring from the Party's office, after some 30 years, to become our Group Leader on Braintree District Council. John Spademan took over Lyn's vacancy at the Party's office. Although the role of local Organiser remained vacant during 2023, it was filled in the new year when we welcomed into that role. We look forward to unseating both Conservative MPs during the forthcoming general election.

#### Review of financial activities

The year under review saw a dramatic improvement in our financial situation. This was due to: a major vacancy remaining unfilled for the whole year; a substantial business rates refund and adjustment and; a full year of rent from National Car Parks. 2024 should see us returning to a more normal situation.

The Party invested £2,106 in sundry tangible fixed assets during the year.

The Party's capital position remains strong with the General Fund standing at £128,074 and Branch Funds at £690. Our bank balances remain healthy at £99,600 against last year's £63,451.

We are hopeful for continued improvements in the coming year and our Treasurers will continue to keep a sharp eye on all our activities.

The Party's was successful in appealing for a reduction and reassessment in its business rates. The gross amount of the refund was £44,076 of which £34,038 was received in 2023 and £10,038 in 2022. #### 18. Branches

The Party's branch structure has been referred to in the review for the year, as above. #### 19 Related Party Transactions

- (b) During the year under review £1,200 was paid to PJ Long for travelling expenses. PJ Long was tasked to regularly check up on the Party's premises and car park on a non remunerated basis. He was reimbursed for his travelling using approved mileage rates. The arrangement has been approved by the Party's Executive Committee.
