## **Political activities**

### **Overview of political activities**

There were all out elections in May 2023 in Slough Borough Council, The Royal Borough of Windsar and Maidenhead and Bracknell Farest Council where we fielded candidate in all wards in all of these councils. We suffered losses in Bracknell Forest and The Royal Barough of Windsor and Maidenhead which resulted in us losing control of the council.

We were able to win control of Slough Borough Council with the help of Slough Liberal Democrats resulting in o change in control helped somewhat by Slough Labour putting the council into S114 and increasing council tax by 10%.

The Boundary changes took effect in June 2023 and our Bracknell Forest wards moved to the Maidenhead and Bracknell Associations. We also welcome Virginia Water, Englefield Green and 3 new wards in Slough.

It has been agreed between the Associations involved that any financial adjustment will be resolved after the next General Election.

#### Income overview

There has been a small fall in income overall. Membership has fallen during the year and this is largely due to the boundary changes as we lost more members than we gained in the year. This has largely been helped by the rental income from the second which has made up for the loss in membership income and helped towards the fall in fundraising income.

### Expenditure overview

Continuing expenditure

Expenditure is higher this year due to the election expenses for the elections in Bracknell Forest, Slough Borough and The Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead. We also employed a campaign manager in October 2023 in order to help fight the election which was not budgeted for at the time of setting the 2023 budget.

### **Balance sheet overview**

Cash at the bank has decreased to £54,780. We will need to continue to fund raise to help support the costs of the next general election.
