Political activities

Overview of political activities

2023 was WCA's first non-pandemic year without a major election since 2016. Therefore, our activities focussed on preparation for the general and mayoral / GLA elections expected in 2024. WCA gathered over 2,000 voter intentions and produced multiple leaflets and voter surveys. We are also proud to have won the party's incentive scheme for London associations.

Cllr Ellie Cox was selected as our GLA candidate for Merton and Wandsworth, and our group leader on Merton Council, Cllr Nick McLean, was selected as a GLA list candidate. In September, Stephen Hammond MP announced that he would be standing down at the next general election, at which point WCA initiated the selection process for our new parliamentary candidate, which was scheduled to conclude in January 2024.

Financial Activities

Income overview

Membership numbers have declined over the year. Additionally, whilst the Membership fee has increased from £25 to £39 for new members during 2023 (and for all renewing members in 2024), the levy retained by CCHQ has also increased from £10 to £15.60. Subsequently some members who had previously been paying the minimum fee have not renewed.

Donations in 2022 included £30,000 from the Merton Council Conservative Group towards the Local Council Election campaign.

In 2022 fundraising included a highly successful Gala Event for the launch of the Local Council election campaign. Fundraising in 2023 was greatly subdued as the Association struggled with the loss of many councillors.

Branch expenditure in 2023 includes £339 on Management and Trustee Liability Insurance paid directly by Wimbledon Conservative Association. In 2022 this was paid by the Wandsworth and Wimbledon Group.

Under an agreement (1 Jan 2012) all net income earned by the Association is transferred to the Wandsworth and Wimbledon Conservative Group (WWCG) to pay group expenditure.

Balance sheet overview

Following the vesting of the Boundary Commission changes, Kingston & Surbiton Conservative Association (KSCA) were required to transfer £94,710 to Wimbledon Conservative Association (WCA) to cover the transfer of Old Malden & St. James to WCA. £84,000 in cash was received during 2023 and the remaining amount is included as a debtor. Canon Hill ward was transferred from WCA to Mitcham & Morden Conservative Association (M&M). An agreement was reached between WCA & M&M whereby instead of making a cash transfer between the Association Bank Accounts, WCA would provide campaigning resources with M&M.

There was an increase of £21,313 in the Fair Value Reserve, reflecting an improvement in the market value of fund units.
