Note 16 Contingent Liability

Pension

One of the Association's former employees was a member of the Conservative Agents' Superannuation Fund which is a defined benefit pension scheme. The scheme currently has a deficit of about £6.2million of which this ex-employees share Is 0.89%. The Association has been advised that as it had an active member at the time of the closure of the Fund to future accrual in 2011, it is legally responsible for the Fund's deficit in the case of insolvency. However, it is the understanding of the Association that when the employee left their new employer employed them on the basis of continuity of service back to 15 April 1996 and hence they took on the legal responsibility for this deficit. The Association is currently seeking legal advice to confirm this position.

Property repairs

Following a Fabric Survey Report commissioned by the Association's landlord the Association has been made aware that much repair work needs to be carried out to the property. The Association's share of these costs are expected to be in the region of £35,000.
