Overview of political activities

Campaigning activities during the early part of the year were focused on supporting our candidates in the May 2023 Horsham District Council and Mid-Sussex District Council elections. For these elections we were able to field a full state of candidates and fought all 38 seats in our constituency area.

After these district elections, campaigning activity switched to preparing for the General Election. The Association has organised numerous campaign days which have involved door to door canvassing, delivering surveys and leaflet deliveries. The Association has also focused on digital campaigning and improving our online presence. Branches

The Association started 2023 with 9 geographical branches, however, due to the realignment of associations with new parliamentary boundaries, 2 of these branches moved to the new East Grinstead and Uckfield Association.

Non-geographical branches whose income and expenditure are included in these accounts comprised a Conservative Women's Organisation; a Young Conservatives group; a Conservative Policy Forum; a Business Club and Horsham Patrons.

Financial Activities

Income overview

Fund-raising activities were relatively limited whilst the Association focused on local elections campaigning and the vesting process to realign the Association with the new parliamentary boundaries. We were able to hold our Annual Dinner and a range of smaller events in Gough House and around the constituency including some branch events.

Expenditure overview

Campaigning expenditure was significantly higher in 2023, mainly in support of the District Council elections and subsequently to support campaigning activities in the lead up to the General Election.

The Association has recorded a deficit for 2023. The main reasons for this deficit were the movement of assets that followed the vesting process following the parliamentary boundary changes. Also, increases to our running costs and maintaining The Association has already undertaken significant actions to reduce these overheads and ensure more of our resources are available for campaigning which is our primary function.
