## REVIEW OF POLITICAL ACTIVITIES Brentford & Isleworth CLP Chair's report - AGM 2023

This is a vibrant, active party and I am pleased to say that our CLP has been a locus of campaigning activity, and not just on the doorstep.

I'm incredibly touched by the support so many members of this CLP have offered to our campaign in Isleworth to save Park Road Allotments from the Duke of Northumberland's bulldozers. We were able to get the plans thrown out by Hounslow Council, and when the Duke appealed we successfully fought for a full public inquiry, for which we now await the result. This CLP was also instrumental in saving a vital bus route to West Middlesex Hospital.

I want to thank the organisers and all the officers of the CLP over these last four years in working with me to put together these actions and activities. Special mention must go to the two Secretaries I served with, and and activities, of all their hard work. And the Hall of Fame spot is reserved for outgoing and long-serving Treasurer for everything he has done to keep our CLP's finances robust, which will support all our campaigns going forward.

I'm proud that this CLP, working with Feltham & Heston, has returned a progressive Labour council that has built over 1,000 new council homes in the last administration and will build 1,000 more in this. That has committed to net zero by 2030, planting



20,000 trees and installing 2,000 EV charge points by 2026, and building a borough that is 45% green.

That's the difference Labour can make in local government. This time next year, I suspect we'll see what Labour can do in national government. But there's a long way to go and a lot of work ahead. I am confident this new CLP is ideally placed to play its part.

#### Membership

At 31 December 2023, Brentford & Isleworth's membership stood at 1033, an increase of 65 new members over 2022.

#### REVIEW OF FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES

At 31 December 2023 the CLP had a total income of £22,292 against an expenditure of £50,407, meaning a net loss of £28116.00.

However, the CLP benefited from a total income from property of £64710, against an expenditure of £32084, producing a net profit from property of £32627.

Thus overall, the CLP was in profit by £4511.

Ruth's Gala Dinner in November 2023 raised £11629; such an event did not take place in 2022. However, there was a significant reduction in income from 'Subscriptions and salary subsidy' of £20k. In mitigation, Borough Organiser costs were reduced by 17K, a situation that will not be repeated in 2024 since the agreement of a full-time contract with the Borough Organiser in post since November 2023.
