#### Political activities

## Overview of political activities

The Association faced up to its last few months of its existence, following the enactment of the Boundary Commission's proposals for Parliamentary Constituency boundaries reform. Two issues dominated during this time.

Firstly, the campaign for the local elections to the East Riding of Yorkshire Council in May 2023. We fielded a full slate of candidates. We were defending 11 seats from a total of 17 in our constituency. In the event, we lost 3 seats, in a rather poor night for the Party nationally, so we were down to 8 Conservative councillors. In the wider East Riding, the Conservatives lost overall control of the Council but remain the largest Party and were able to form an administration with the aid of a number of Independent councillors.

The second main issue was the closure of the Haltemprice and Howden Conservative Association and the absorption of sizeable portions into three new Constituency Associations. The final meeting of the Association's Executive Council on 21<sup>st</sup> July 2023 decided that the assets of the Association should be distributed to the new Associations in the ratio of the number of full members of each branch on that date. The main asset being the Conservative Office in Willerby, of which we were the freeholders, the Trustees concerned were requested to put the property on the market and obtain the best possible price for it. [This was subsequently achieved.] The Association was finally dissolved, following the timetable set by the Party regionally, at a Special General Meeting on July 26<sup>th</sup> 2023.

Before the final dissolution, members of our Executive Council, as appropriate, had help to bring into being the new constituencies of Hull West & Hessle, Hull North & Cottingham and Goole & Pocklington. In the latter case, they helped to select Sir David Davis MP as the prospective Conservative candidate at the next General Election. In all cases, they helped to reselect Jonathan Evison as the Conservative candidate for the Humberside PCC election due in May 2024.

I was fated to be the last Chairman of the Haltemprice & Howden Conservative Association. It existed for twenty five years and, although it had its fair share of problems at times, it was generally highly successful. Its members can look back on its achievements with a degree of pride.

# **Branches**

The Association had five active branches in Howden and Howdenshire; Dale; Ferriby, Swanland, Melton and Welton; Haltemprice Central; and Cottingham.

There was also a Constituency Women's Organisation.

## **Financial Activities**

#### Income overview

Income for the part year period was £13,835 a reduction of £10,990 on the previous full year. The part year results from the Constituency being wound up following the boundary changes.

# Continuing expenditure

Even though 2023 is a part year up to July expenditure fell by just £1,152. This is due to a redundancy payment of £5,052 and a higher level of Campaigning costs in 2023.

## Additional investment

#### Balance sheet overview

Total reserves at the end of the year were £46,720, a reduction of £17,660. This is due mainly to the operating loss incurred of £17,659.

Cash in hand and at the bank at the end of the period amounted to £7,667 a decrease of £16,409 over the period. This again is mainly due to the operating loss incurred.
